Red Bank, NJ – From January 17 through February 4, Two River Theater Company will present **Craig Wright's *The Pavilion*** directed by TRTC's new Artistic Director **Aaron Posner**. *The Pavilion* is a sad, funny, and highly theatrical tale about love, loss, and hope. From the creation of the universe to a 20th high school reunion in tiny Pine City, Minnesota, Craig Wright's play is a "lyrical discourse on missed chances and lost opportunities." (*New York Times*) Humor, sadness and universal truths from the Emmy-nominated writer of *Lost* and *Six Feet Under* creates "one of those exhilarating, cathartic plays that made you want to go into theatre in the first place" (*BackStage*).

**Aaron Posner**, Two River Theater Company's new Artistic Director, explains why he chose this play: "I wanted my first show at Two River to be something I really believe in, something that I have an investment in. This is a play I work shopped with Craig for two years before we did the premiere in Pittsburgh seven years ago. I have been an active participant in its growth and success, and it is a play that I believe is truly worthwhile. So it seemed a perfect way to start things here. Plus **Craig Wright** is my favorite living playwright. His work speaks to me in simple and profound ways. He explores the things that bind us together and the things that pull us apart – the big issues that make up the texture of our lives. And he does it while being funny, reverent, irreverent and smart, all at the same time. His plays are the best kind of juggling acts."

**Craig Wright** is a prolific, award-winning playwright who has also written *Main Street*, *Orange Flower Water*, *Recent Tragic Events*, *Molly's Delicious*, *Melissa Arctic* (Helen Hayes Award for Outstanding New Play), and *Grace*. He is the recipient of fellowships from the McKnight Foundation and the National Endowment for the Arts. Wright currently writes for TV's *Brothers & Sisters*.

The cast of three includes the former sweethearts portrayed by **Kate Eastwood Norris** (regional credits include numerous Shakespeare productions, plus two Helen Hayes award nominations for Outstanding Lead Actress) and **Erik Steele** (last seen as Cleante in TRTC's *Tartuffe*. Off-Broadway credits include *Hedda Gabler*, *Bloody Poetry*, *A Floating Roof*, *The Rivals*, and *Macbeth*). **Andrew Polk** (Broadway Tour of

*Biloxi Blues*, Off-Broadway credits include *Flight*, *Critical Darling*, *The Odyssey*, *Vick's Boy*, *The Truth Teller*, *Scaring The Fish*, and *The Ash Fire*) will be The Narrator as well as a dozen other characters.

The production will feature scenic design by **David P. Gordon** (winner of three Barrymore Awards, Elliot Norton Award, IRNE and CT Critics Circle Award nominations), lighting design by **Deb Sullivan**, costume design by **Devon Painter**, and sound design by **James Sugg** (winner of four Barrymores for Outstanding Sound Design and the F. Otto Haas Award for Emerging Theater Artist).

**The Pavilion** begins previews on Wednesday, January 17; opens Saturday, January 20; and runs through Sunday, February 4. Tickets are \$30 - \$54 and are available by contacting the TRTC Box Office at **732.345.1400** or by visiting the box office at 21 Bridge Avenue in Red Bank. TRTC has scheduled an **audio described performance** on Thursday, February 1 at 8pm. **Post-show discussions** are scheduled following the matinees on Wednesdays, January 24 and January 31, and following the 8pm performance on Saturday, January 28. **Discounted group rates** are available through the Box Office or by calling TRTC's Director of Sales Sydney Mehrlander at 732.345.1400 ext 813.
